The Core that Fuels Terry Home's Success

Each morning, the residents who call Terry Home their home wake up assured of one thing: The Terry Home staff is there to serve them with support, encouragement, and personal attention.

One Terry Home staff member took the time to set up job training sessions for a resident, drove him to each session, and stayed with him. Then this employee helped the resident learn the job--all on the employee's own time.

One Christmas, another staff member made coffee mugs and towels for each resident with their names imprinted on them.

These are a just a few examples of how Terry Home's employees--17 women and three men--go the extra mile as they serve as the core of Terry Home's success. They do this by making sure each resident's needs are met while creating a family environment that is filled with learning and laughter.

Joann Norman, who manages the staff, sings the caregivers' praises. "These wonderful individuals are responsible for just about everything--assisting residents with everyday living activities, showering, toileting, dressing, therapy and all those other things we take for granted."

But that's just the beginning. Joanne points out that these dedicated caregivers go far beyond providing residents with life's basics. Staff also:

- Clean, do laundry, cook, garden, cut hair, and take residents to the doctor, shopping, and to fun activities.
- Give up free time to ensure residents are doing well.
- Take residents to concerts or events that they wouldn't otherwise be able to attend—all on their personal time.
- Use their own resources on occasion to purchase items that the residents want but cannot afford.
- Attend Terry Home fundraisers and help residents be creative, such as growing plants that are sold at events.

Myla Montgomery, president of the Terry Home board, said she sees how important the residents are to the staff by the way they lovingly care for each resident every day. "We all have challenges and we all need help along the way," Myla said. "We thank God that these people have been sent to us to care for our residents. "

"All I know, Joanne added, "is Terry Home would never exist without the men and women who work for us and care so much for our residents. I am forever grateful for what they do."
